

MUH vs. Fine Used : A personal view.

I recently ordered a small number of decimal stamps from my favourite on line dealer.

The transaction proceeded in the familiar way with email confirmation of the stamps ordered, invoice sent,

EFT payment processed and finally an email informing that the stamps were on the way. Subsequently my package arrived (4 days later than it would have 6 months ago, thanks to Australia Post's new delivery procedures)

To my surprise on opening my little package I found, certainly the stamps that I had ordered, but alas, copies of stamps not in the condition that I had specified.

An enclosed note read

"Hello, we have had difficulty sourcing Fine Used copies of the issues that you requested. Where this occurred I have substituted MUH or CTO copies. No extra charge. Regards etc..."

NO, NO, MR Dealer. I ordered genuine postally used fine copies, because that is what I collect.

Pristine pieces of paper with gum on the reverse, I do not want.

I want my stamps to have done what they are created for, to have been adhered to an envelope or parcel, bear the evidence that they have been "through the hoops", been reclaimed and can be admired for what they have done.

Pampered, protected, unspoilt, inexperienced, gummed pieces of paper that promise much but have done nothing are not my preference.

"No extra charge"

Indeed, there shouldn't be! Why a premium for MUH? Much more time, effort and expense goes into a fine used copy of a stamp than buying it over the counter at the P. O.

Furthermore: The genuinely postally used fine copies in my order were costed at \$19.55. The same stamps MUH according to my dealers list would cost \$31.50. More than 60% extra, how ridiculous!

To paraphrase one well known philatelist ***"Why pay for gum"?***

I rest my case.

For this collector Fine Used beats MUH every time. I look forward to an alternate view.

Postal District Numbers of Melbourne

In 1967 ***Postcodes*** were introduced Australia wide. (No specific date known; maybe it was a gradual process?)

Earlier, Melbourne had Postal District Numbers based on the London codes with a letter (or letters) denoting the direction from the main city post office and a number appended to, generally, to correlate with the relative distance (in miles). An earlier system from around 1923 with twelve districts or 54 (unsure why there is doubt about this number) which had failed due to neglect was replaced. 

Great Britain – Invalidation of Pre-Decimal Postage Stamps – John Ogle

Pre-decimal postage stamps were invalidated from 1st March, 1972, little over two years from the issue of low value decimal definitive. Many European countries, switching to the Euro from traditional currencies, allowed longer periods to use ‘old currency’ stamps. Was the Post Office, mindful of the vast stocks of mint stamps held by speculators, dealers, and the general public? Their impending invalidity made dispersal of large stocks very difficult even on the ‘cheap postage’ market where huge discounts on face value were available.

Wilding definitives, not previously sold out, were withdrawn from sale at the Philatelic Bureau on 27th February, 1970. Similarly, all pre-decimal Regional, **Machin** definitives (excepting the £1 value) and Special Issues were withdrawn from sale on 25th November, 1971.
