We now have the 2016/17 treasure hunt underway with questions set by Roman, a nice selection and plenty of variety. Please enter into the spirit of the competition which is run to honour the memory of our past Secretary Lois Whatley who held that position for over 30 years.

Victorian *Barred Numeral 787* was issued to the postmaster at *Diamond Hill* on 1 September 1872. [closed 21<sup>st</sup> June 1947 but, of course, the barred numeral would have finished long before this! – *Ed.*]. A friend is writing a history of Diamond Hill and mining activity there and would love to get a nice copy of 787 preferably on piece or cover to put in his publication. [a member has since found & supplied – *Ed.*]. According to Stamp boards it is RR which I think means "Really Rare" as opposed to "RRRR" really, really, really, rare".

For non-Bendigonians the area of Diamond Hill is to the South East of Kangaroo Flat as you enter Bendigo on the Calder Highway. It is still quite scrubby and would have been tough work in 1872. The annual report of the Victorian Post Office and Telegraph Dept for 1873 says the Postmaster was Hugh Nixon who ran a store on Diamond Hill. To carry mail to and from Kangaroo Flat by horseback six days a week from 1 Sept to 31 Dec 1872 cost eight pounds.

## The Four Chaplains

My father, having been a Chaplain in the Australia Army during World War II, had a copy of this stamp, albeit somewhat heavily cancelled, in his collection. There was also a newspaper clipping with abbreviated information as follows:

"Illustrated here is an unusual stamp from the U.S.A. depicting four Chaplains (or Padres) of different faiths. It commemorates the Revs. George L. Fox and Clark V. Poling, who were Protestants, the Rev. Father John P. Washington, a Roman



Catholic and the Rev. Alexander D. Goode, a Jewish Rabbi. When the U.S. transport 'Dorchester' was torpedoed off Greenland in 1943, they helped to hand out life jackets and encouraged panicking soldiers to jump. When all the jackets had gone the four chaplains gave away their own. They were last seen standing with arms linked on the deck as the ship went down, praying together. The issuance of the stamp was unique because it was issued less than ten years after the men died. Customarily, the Post Office Department (now the U.S. Postal Service) did not issue commemorative stamps until ten years after the person had died. Historically, this may be the first stamp commemorating a Jew. It is undoubtedly, the first U.S. postage stamp designed by a Jew that commemorates a Jew." (vgm)

## William Penn Adair "Will" Rogers

Wish I could be like that! This man inspired me from a very early age but I knew nothing about him! (vgm)

William Penn Adair "Will" Rogers (November 4, 1879 – August 15, 1935) was an American cowboy, vaudeville performer, humourist, newspaper columnist, social commentator, and stage and motion picture actor.

Known as "Oklahoma's Favourite Son", Rogers was born to a prominent Cherokee Nation family in Indian Territory (now part of Oklahoma). He travelled around the world three times, made 71 movies (50 silent films and 21



"talkies"), and wrote more than 4,000 nationally syndicated newspaper columns. By the mid-1930s, the American people adored Rogers. He was the leading political wit of his time, and was the highest paid Hollywood movie star. Rogers died in 1935 with aviator Wiley Post, when their small airplane crashed in northern Alaska.

Rogers's vaudeville rope act led to success in the Ziegfeld Follies, which in turn led to the first of his many movie contracts. His 1920s syndicated newspaper column and his radio appearances increased his visibility and popularity. Rogers crusaded for aviation expansion, and provided Americans with first-hand accounts of his world travels. His earthy anecdotes and folksy style allowed him to poke fun at gangsters, prohibition, politicians, government programs, and a host of other controversial topics in a way that was appreciated by a national audience, with no one offended. His aphorisms, couched in humorous terms, were widely quoted: "I am not a member of an organized political party. I am a Democrat." Another widely quoted Will Rogers comment was "I don't make jokes. I just watch the government and report the facts."

Rogers even provided an epigram on his most famous epigram:

When I die, my epitaph, or whatever you call those signs on gravestones, is going to read: "I joked about every prominent man of my time, but I never met a man I dident [sic] like." I am so proud of that, I can hardly wait to die so it can be carved.

Larry's stamp collection was stolen, and Susan, his wife, called the insurance company: "We had that collection insured for fifty thousand and I want my money". Agent: "Whoa there just a minute, Susan. It doesn't work quite like that. We will ascertain the value of the collection and provide you with a similar one of comparable worth". Susan, after a pause: "I'd like to cancel the policy on my husband ..."
