EXCHANGE SHEET DAY!!!


We all have trouble with setting aside time to make up exchange sheets so we have decided to have a combined members exchange sheet production day.

Fair Dinkum Aussie Alphabet Stamps

The overwhelming thing about the internet is just how much there is of it. So much, in fact that the energy required to store it all is a measureable contributor to the current climate crisis. But setting aside the doom and gloom for a while, there are gems to be found there - and a few surprises.

A recent internet search turned up this news article from the Ballarat Courier (March 2017) about a participant at the Ballarat Stamp Fair - our own Ken Datson.

Bendigo philatelist's elephant-sized stamp collection

Bendigo stamp collector Ken Datson has 500 stamps featuring elephants from more than 60 countries.

Mr Datson began collecting 15 years ago after first his daughter, and then his son, lost interest in their own collections.

"I was retrenched in 2000 so I thought 'I need a hobby' and took on stamp collecting. It's just history from there."

The gem of his collection is a Polish stamp of an elephant in black and white, which he has in used and mint – unused – condition.

Mr Datson's collection includes stamps featuring elephants from Russia, Germany, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand.

"It was just something no one else collected and there are so many different variations," Mr Datson said.

"Another one I really do like is of the elephants where they have their trunks in the form of an SOS."

Mr Datson was at the Ballarat Begonia Festival Stamp and Coin Fair at Ballarat Special School on Monday.
